Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Every year, when it comes time to create the financial reports for each parish, I am overwhelmed to see the generosity of our parishioners. I see the steady giving at each financial meeting, but when it's all totaled up at the end of the fiscal year, it truly is amazing to see the support you all give to this parish and this cluster. Thank you!

Once again, the parishioners of Holy Trinity did a great job making sure we keep this place running. We hit our yearly giving goal right on track and the last year's Czech Days (covered in this report) was one of our best ever! It was a fantastic success netting over \$89,000 which is almost half of our yearly budget. This year's event is looking to be as good if not better! Thanks for all you do to grow our community and our parish with Czech Days!

A major change that you may notice over the next year will be how we support Trinity Catholic School in the cluster. When the various parish schools were merged years ago, three of the parishes in the cluster did not have Catholic schools to merge with the others. Presumably for that reason, only the parishes in Protivin, Fort Atkinson, and St. Lucas had formal agreements to financially support the school even though students came from all six parishes of the cluster. With the support of all six finance councils, the cluster council, the Trinity school board, and the Archdiocese, that arrangement changed this year. Now, all six parishes of the cluster contribute subsidies to the school. This change brings with it a significant financial advantage for all involved. Parishes who formally support a Catholic school get a substantial break on the subsidy they are required to pay the Archdiocese (taxa). Now all six parishes will take advantage of this benefit and parishes like Holy Trinity will see their required support decreased with more parishes shouldering the load. More importantly, supporting Catholic education is a major part of who we are as Catholics and unites us with the other parishes in the cluster.

While we enjoyed financial and educational success this year, that is just part of our mission here. Our true mission is to know God, love God, and serve God in this world and be happy with him forever in the next. The best thing we can do to contribute to that mission is worship Him at Holy Mass! The grace we receive from the sacraments helps us every day to live the life we are called to. Please continue to ask your friends and neighbors to join us each weekend so that we can grow our community and our faith!
